A Bill

A Bill regarding the One-to-One Technology Initiative

WHEREAS Concord-Carlisle Regional High School plans to implement the One-to-One Technology Initiative during the 2015-2016 school year.

WHEREAS Concord-Carlisle Regional High School students have not engaged in enough meaningful dialogue regarding the One-to-One Technology Initiative.

WHEREAS the potential costs of the One-to-One Technology Initiative may outweigh the potential benefits of the One-to-One Technology Initiative.

WHEREAS Concord-Carlisle High School students and teachers have not collaborated with the administration on the One-to One Technology Initiative.

WHEREAS a monitoring system for all computers has not been presented and discussed by the community before purchasing.

WHEREAS a budget plan has not been created for all possible scenarios (ie too many people want to borrow, too many people want to bring their own devices, etc).

WHEREAS a full explanation of how and when the computers will be used in the classroom has not been explained. This must include screen time (during school and homework), whether or not using the computer will be optional (ie notes), how the computers will be charged.

WHEREAS a plan for tech support for every student has not been communicated (is it

always available, how many people will be on the tech support team, will it be enough to help all students, will the tech team be able to help students who bring their own devices)

Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate, That

1. Concord-Carlisle Regional High School delays the implementation of the One-to-One Technology Initiative until the 2016-2017 school year.
2. Students and teachers have or call meetings on the One-to-One Technology Initiative in advisory or after school.
